Job Description: The EMMA project (<http://www.emmanet.org/>) is a multi-centric European consortium that is responsible for the collection, cryopreservation and distribution of mouse mutant strains which are essential for biomedical research. The laboratory mouse is the most important mammalian model for studying genetic and multi-factorial diseases in man. Thus the work of EMMA will play a crucial role in exploiting the tremendous potential benefits to human health presented by the current research in mammalian genetics.

We are looking for a Web Developer who will be responsible for the development and maintenance of the public and internal EMMA websites, as well as all the web interfaces that are used internally to access and update the EMMA relational database.

Qualifications and Experience: The Web Developer should hold a degree in Computer Science or Bioinformatics, and have at least 3 years programming experience. Familiarity with the design of web-based application interfaces is desirable. High proficiency in JAVA, including JSPs and servlets, and in Javascript is expected, and a working knowledge of other languages such as Perl will be a definite advantage. Experience with relational databases, preferably MySQL and Oracle, is desirable. In addition, the post holder should be comfortable working in a Unix environment. We are looking for a candidate who enjoys working in a team environment as well as who has good communication and interpersonal skills. Good English skills are a requirement.

Contract: An initial contract of 3 years will be offered to the successful candidate. This can be renewed, depending on circumstances at the time of review.
